



Johns Creek Approved Proprietary Water Quality Devices

The following note must be on the drawings and in the engineer's design report.

All devices that use infiltration to achieve their function require a field infiltration test prior to installation at the elevation and location where the unit is to be installed and a letter from a registered geotechnical engineer stating that the field conditions meet or exceed the design requirements for the unit.

The StormTech Isolator row is an approved proprietary device. Designer must state what infiltration rate and safety factor was used in the design. Design must state the infiltration rate and factor of safety applied.

The Filterra system recently went through the MNGWPD approval process and the City will accept that system.
