## Basic Facts

Through PACT Johns Creek residents and police work together to prevent neighborhood crime and share information.

PACT is similar to a traditional Neighborhood Watch except it does not require 75 percent participation by a residential neighborhood. It's FREE, simple, and flexible:

### Each PACT member:

- designs its own Neighborhood Watch
- is assigned a JCPD officer liaison
- chooses a contact for the liaison
- shares suspicious activity/crime information with JCPD

PACT is not a 100% guarantee that crime will not happen, and participants should not take any personal risks in trying to solve or prevent a crime.

## Crime Prevention

No matter how safe a community is, crime prevention is a concern. PACT members are the JCPD's "extra eyes and ears" and create a proactive, community-oriented approach to public safety.

Crime can diminish a community's quality of life with significant ramifications on property values and the local economy. The financial costs of crime are born by the victims, their families, insurers, and the community as a whole.

Any neighborhood crime can be viewed as an opportunity for education. Through PACT, the JCPD strives to educate residents about:



- how to protect yourself and property
- how to report a crime (details police need)
- context of crimes reported in local media
- facts about the likelihood of victimization

## Information sharing

PACT enables quick information sharing between the JCPD and residents. This information can be about the nature and volume of burglaries in a neighborhood, or specifics on how to secure residential property, or immediate alerts on a crime in progress.

Misinformation about alleged criminal activities can be harmful and disruptive. PACT enables quick dissemination of accurate information directly from the JCPD.
